

STES Group in Cameroon: Upon the invitation from the University of Ngaoundéré, STES Group's representative held a presentation on July 7th, 2019 on the Internet of Things and solar technologies and their applications. This was conducted before students and staff from the university with a purpose to



identify training opportunities to university students and their staff to boost innovation culture in their institution.

Afric'Up Summit:

DSSD sponsored 8 start-ups to attend the Afric'up Summit which took place in Tunisia under the theme "Smart Cities & Open Innovation in Africa, What Opportunities for Start-ups?".

Facebook Developers Circle: The Digicenter has been host to the last two Kigali Facebook developer meetups.

Traditional Values Influencing Digitalization Event: The centre hosted over 80 people for this event that included; a panel discussion on the influence of Rwandan culture/traditions on digitalization and group sessions presentations.

Blockchain Rwanda Meet-up: The centre hosted an event organised by NIRDA that brought together different community members who wanted to learn about blockchain and its opportunities.

AI/VR/AR Meet up: In partnership with NIRDA the DigiCenter hosted 6 meetups for the tech community members interested in the topics of Artificial Intelligence, Virtual Reality and Augmented Reality.

Face the Gorillas Pitching event by ICT Chamber: The centre acted as a host for this event organized by the ICT chamber.

Innovate4Education - Virtual Labs pre-pitching session including 16 participants and a 1-week bootcamp was hosted at the centre.

CCHub Pitchdrive - The DigiCenter hosted 10 CCHub teams for a pitch drive event in preparation for their Asia tour.

Code & Design Camp – The centre hosted over 30 female university students for a 4-day bootcamp facilitated by Code+Design.
